

Sermon Title: In The Sanctuary

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Scripture: Psalm 73:1-7, 12-14, 16-26

¹Surely God is good to Israel,

to those who are pure in heart.

²But as for me, my feet had almost slipped;

I had nearly lost my foothold.

³ For I envied the arrogant

When I saw the prosperity of the wicked.

⁴They have no struggles;

their bodies are healthy and strong.

⁵ They are free from common human burdens;

they are not plagued by human ills.

⁶ Therefore pride is their necklace;

they clothe themselves with violence.

⁷ From their callous hearts comes iniquity

their evil imaginations have no limits.

12 This is what the wicked are like—

Always free of care, they go on amassing wealth.

¹³ Surely in vain I have kept my heart pure

and have washed my hands in innocence.

14 All day long I have been afflicted,

and every morning brings new punishments.

¹⁶ When I tried to understand all this,

it troubled me deeply

¹⁷ Till I entered the sanctuary of God;

then I understood their final destiny.

¹⁸ Surely you place them on slippery ground; you cast them down to ruin.

¹⁹ How suddenly are they destroyed,

completely swept away by terrors!

²⁰ They are like a dream when one awakes;

when you arise, Lord,

you will despise them as fantasies.

- ²¹ When my heart was grieved and my spirit embittered,
- ²²I was senseless and ignorant; I was a brute beast before you.
- ²³ Yet I am always with you; you hold me by my right hand.
- ²⁴ You guide me with your counsel, and afterward you will take me into glory.
- ²⁵ Whom have I in heaven but you? And earth has nothing I desire besides you.
- ²⁶ My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever.
