

## **Sermon Title: Telling the Story**

**Opening Question:** Looking back to last week's sermon and scripture... How did you live differently or practice what we talked about in your life this week? What did you do and how did it go?

## This week's scripture:

## Luke 1:46-55

<sup>46</sup> And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord

and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

<sup>48</sup> for he has been mindful

of the humble state of his servant.

From now on all generations will call me blessed,

- for the Mighty One has done great things for me—holy is his name.
- <sup>50</sup> His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation.
- <sup>51</sup> He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.
- <sup>52</sup> He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.
- <sup>53</sup> He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty.
- <sup>54</sup> He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful
- 55 to Abraham and his descendants forever, just as he promised our ancestors."

**Scripture Reflection Questions**: Read this week's scripture together and discuss the followina:

• What do we learn about God (e.g., traits, personality, what matters, priorities) in this passage?

• What do we learn about people, and ourselves in particular, this week?

**Sermon Reflection Questions**: Reflecting on this week's sermon, discuss the following:

- How can Mary's psalm shape your prayer life this week?
- How can you say "Yes" to God this week even if God's guidance to you looks very different than you expected?

**Closing Question and Application**: Given what we've discussed together today, how might God want you to apply these learnings to your life or in the life of your community this next week? Who might you share this with?

**Closing group prayer**: Spend a few minutes together in your group sharing prayer requests and then praying together for each other. Thank God for the time together, the conversation shared, the other people in the group, and for encouragement in the week ahead.
