

## Sermon Title: Lost and Found

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Scripture: John 1:1-4, 10-12, 14

<sup>1</sup>In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. <sup>2</sup>He was with God in the beginning. <sup>3</sup>Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. <sup>4</sup>In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.

<sup>10</sup> He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. <sup>11</sup> He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. <sup>12</sup> Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—

<sup>14</sup> The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

## Discussion Questions:

- 1. What does John tell us about the "Word" in John 1:1-3?
- 2. John's introduction of Jesus is different than the other Gospel writers, Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Why do think that is?
- 3. What is the significance of Jesus being God to you? How does that impact you life?
- 4. In what ways do you see God pitching His tent in your neighborhood?
- 5. When you look at yourself, do you fall under, I am more about "Truth" or more about "Grace"? Why is that? Typically, people tend to lean toward one side or the other.
